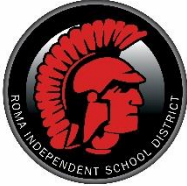

Discussion:

- Mrs. Leticia Cadena welcomed the members to the meeting and introduced the new members. Members were given attendance and procedures regarding District SBDM meetings. Mrs. Cadena directed the members to the District website and referred to [District Policy BQA \(Local\) and \(Legal\)](#) where information about the purpose and functions of the committee can be found.
- PBMAS results were shared with the members by Program Directors.
 - Ms. Melizza Galvan shared PBMAS for *Special Ed* and shared concern regarding indicators 1, 3 and 9) with high numbers, meaning that the Special Education program is in Stage 2. She assured the committee that steps are being taken to address the situation.
 - Mrs. Yadira E. Diaz presented on the PBMAS - Bilingual Education on Mrs. Celia Guerra's behalf and shared concerns regarding several indicators with high performance levels; however, the Bilingual Department is not staged. She assured the committee that steps are being taken to address the high numbers in indicators 2, 5, and 9.
 - Mr. Joe Martinez shared PBMAS for Career and Technology Education. He stated that the concerns are in indicators 2 (LEP Science and ELA- PL 2) and 4 (Special Ed. ELA- PL 4). He assured the committee that steps are being taken to address the concerns in indicators 2 and 4. Also, he stated that the CATE program overall is in Stage 1 and doing well with plans for adding new courses in the near future.
 - Mrs. Cruz, Federal Programs Director, shared ESSA Report and informed the committee Indicators 5 and 6 are above the required numbers and that this department is in Stage 1. She assured the committee that steps are being taken to address the Migrant population and this area of concern.
- Mr. Joe Martinez gave a summary of State Compensatory Performance Evaluation comparing All Students versus At-Risk Students. The report was a 3-year summative of the state assessments for all tested areas. He stated that although there were gains in some areas, other areas had a slight decrease. Overall, he stated that our At-Risk population were comparable to All students and that Roma ISD At-Risk students were outperforming other districts throughout the region and state. He proposed to continue to monitor and intervene with students that were at-risk and that the ultimate goal is to help these students graduate and be college and/or career ready. He closed by thanking the campuses and teachers for their efforts and results.
- Mrs. Yadira E. Diaz shared 1st Six Weeks Campus Benchmark results and reminded them to continue to work hard in order for every student to achieve success. She also praised the campuses for continuing to commit to the Professional Learning Community process to positively impact student learning.

- Mr. Noe Guzman compared last year 1st six weeks attendance rates to this year's 1st six weeks attendance rates. The district attendance rate for this year is lower by .7%. Members were asked to continue to be proactive in getting our students to come to school every day. The I & G campus increased their attendance by 6.5%, accolades to them. Also shared with the committee, the possible appeal to the TEA for the excessive absences on Wednesday, September 27, 2017 due to a threat to high school students.

Adjournment:

Leticia Cadena thanked the members for attending and congratulated the campuses with perfect attendance. Members were reminded that the time of the meetings has changed to 7:30 a.m. and that the next meeting will be held on Wednesday, December 6, 2017 in the Manuel Guerra Auditorium at 7:30 a.m.

Without any further business to discuss or questions to answer the meeting was adjourned at 8:20 a.m.
